Chris Huhne MP, the coalition's Environment Secretary, is set to make an opening keynote speech, with a TUC response from Frances O'Grady. Then David Kennedy, CEO of the Committee on Climate Change, will present a climate science and industry briefing. Nine workshops will tackle topics including: the Green Investment Bank, local alliances, green skills, transport, energy market reforms, energy intensive industries, Cancun, and the coalition's plans for the Green Deal.

Fanny Armstrong and other climate experts join our afternoon panel, with Paul Noon, General Secretary of Prospect and TUC General Council lead on climate change; Mick Leahy, GS of Community trade union, the lead union in steelmaking; Jeremy Nicholson, Director of the Energy intensive industries users group; and Joan Walley MP, Chair, Environmental Audit Committee. The panel is followed by a closing contribution from Caroline Lucas MP. Prospect GS Paul Noon chairs the conference.
