Key aims

Intended so that the participants can come together bonded by a Common bargaining base to interrogate:

- their employers' policies and performance
- the changing contours of collective bargaining
- the Union's effectiveness at Sector/Company level.

- organising all employees into the Union
- sustainable workplace organisation
- a strategic approach to bargaining
- tactical imperatives
- an ACTION PLAN for short, medium and long term.
