Having negotiated Agenda for Change, as the terms and conditions in the NHS, we will fight for its future. Employers are increasingly looking to reduce your terms and conditions, and we will work with you and all our members to stop their erosion.

Outsourcing and privatisation, cuts to funding and reorganisations are increasingly threatening Agenda for Change on issues like progression, sickness policies, grading issues, and out of hours arrangements. The government's imposition of pay freezes and pension changes, is also cutting your terms and conditions. For those working outside the NHS, we will always work to defend your contracts, terms and conditions.

Campaigning for our members

Promotion and support of members in their work

Unite has established structure to support workers in the health sector:

- Support to all professional groups in relation to their statutory regulator including individual support and representation by union lawyers in fitness to practice cases
- Lead and professional officers to support the activity of these groups
- Support for "aspirant" professions in establishing regulatory frameworks
- Co-operative working with the statutory regulators

Staying healthy – challenging stress and bullying

Working in the health sector can be hazardous. Unfortunately, not all employers live up to their legal duty to ensure that working environments are safe and healthy. We fully train Health and Safety Representatives to make certain that your working environment is safe.

With staffing levels being cut, workloads increasing, organisational restructuring, work intensification, and skill mix, it is not surprising that employees feel under pressure, and stress-related illness, long working hours and bullying becoming more prevalent. However trained Unite representatives are there to listen and advise. Bullying and stress can be tackled, and working cultures can be changed with support from Unite.



Learning opportunities

Confidence and competence help staff to work more effectively and safely. Unite knows the importance of lifelong learning. We work with employers to ensure that staff are supported in their roles by appropriate training, personal and professional development, including work-based and non-vocational or personal learning.

Unite also has an extensive programme of courses for all its representatives.

Direct Debit Guarantee

- This Guarantee is offered by all banks and building societies that accept instructions to pay Direct Debits.
- If there are any changes to the amount, date or frequency of your Direct Debit Unite the union will notify you ten working days in advance of your account being debited or as otherwise agreed. If you request Unite the union to collect a payment, confirmation of the amount and date will be given to you at the time of the request.
- If an error is made in the payment of your Direct Debit by Unite the union or your bank or building society you are entitled to a full and immediate refund of the amount paid from your bank or building society - If you receive a refund you are not entitled to, you must pay it back when Unite the union asks you to.
- You can cancel a Direct Debit at any time by simply contacting your bank or building society. Written confirmation may be required. Please also notify Unite the union.



Data Protection Notice

 By joining Unite the Union you are providing information which may be used for administrative purposes, the holding of elections and other statutory requirements. If you do not tick the box on page 4 you consent to Unite the Union passing on your information for the promotion of membership services (e.g. insurance). We may disclose your information to our service providers and agents for these purposes. However if we do disclose your information, we will put a contract in place to ensure it is protected.

We or they may contact you by post, telephone, e-mail, text or such other means as we may agree with you from time to time, to let you know about any goods, services or promotions that may be of interest to you. We may keep your information for a reasonable period to contact you about our services.

You have the right to ask for a copy of your information (for which we charge a small fee) and to correct any inaccuracies. To make sure we follow your instructions correctly and to improve our service to you through training our staff, we may monitor or record communications.
