Please Boycott Lil-lets

Help Unite the Union put pressure on this company

Unite believes when a company's biggest market is in the UK, it should support UK jobs. When the Lil-lets factory closed in June 2007, 150 workers lost their jobs and production was exported to Taiwan and Poland.

So we are asking for your support for the Lil-lets workers who were made redundant when their jobs were sent abroad and who have lost out on a discretionary pension payment that other staff had received.

Despite making £millions in profits the company decided that it would not offer an enhanced discretionary pension to 46 employees who were over 50, as Lil-lets' management had done for other staff in the past.

In past redundancy situations Lil-lets paid extra into the pension fund so that workers who took their pension early would not suffer a reduction. However on this occasion the company refused to do so.

As a result these workers will now receive up to 30 per cent less pension than they had hoped. This means they now face a very different retirement than they were planning for. Many won't be able to afford to take the holidays they'd dreamt of. Many of these workers are finding it very difficult to find new jobs and are really worried about their futures.

Our members want the company to reconsider and arrange for these people to get their pension with the discretionary increase.

All negotiations to date have failed and Unite believes a boycott of Lil-lets is the best way to make their private equity owners, Electra do what we believe to be the right thing.
